### **Food & Beverage**

We will eat three daily meals in the SA dining hall and our snacks will be served in the conference room. Each person attending is asked to bring snacks for 100. (fruit, cheese, chips & salsa, crackers, or home made baking is appreciated)

The rooms are not air conditioned so please pack a fan and extension cord.

### **Scent-Free Policy**

You are expected to attend **all workshops**, (in the basement). Please be on time for meals and workshops If you leave the SA property please sign out and back in our CANGRANDS binder at front desk. (we must account for our group at all times)

Children will be taken to an activity just prior to workshops. **Children must be SUPERVISED AT ALL TIMES (FACILITY RULES)**

The conference room has coffee and tea on plus there are some games and cards that you are welcome to use during your free time.

No noise after 9:30pm.

Smokers use the ash can and plus please smoke in designated smoking area only.

No alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs on SA land or coming back with booze on breath. No camper is permitted to possess or use fire, candles, mosquito coils or fireworks of any kind anywhere.

No camper is permitted to possess a knife or any kind of other sharp or dangerous tool or weapon, real or fake.

No swearing or bullying.

Life guard at beach/pool are "IN CHARGE".

Clean up of washroom, bedroom and outside trash is the responsibility of the families sharing your room and hallway.

Reuse your bath towels & facecloth if dirty put outside the door each morning for fresh ones.

Appropriate dress in the dining hall (adults shoulders must be covered).

Footwear must be worn at all times.

Willful damage to camp property and equipment is a serious offense. All campers are expected to treat all property and equipment with the care and the respect accorded to their own personal property.

Any damage or breakage of camp property must be reported and paid for.
